The Journey Towards Leadership

Students and teachers are all asked the same question, are you ready? Ready for the adventure, the hard work, and the journey ahead? Edge of Leadership begins with a three-day leadership experience that pushes the limits of both students and teachers to discover the confidence found in hard work, collaboration, and success. EOL is designed around its three simple but powerful guiding themes for developing young leaders: Connect, Empower, Lead... be the example.

Through shared group experiences and adventures on the High 5 campus and challenge course, students and teachers will:

- Practice using sound judgment and making healthy choices.
- Realize the potential of communication, dialogue, and collaboration.
- Discover the empowering confidence to lead by example.
- · Develop critical thinking and problem solving skills.
- Learn skills for making a positive difference in their school communities.

The EOL experience opens doors to new collaborations between students, teachers and administrators that help make schools and communities work to their highest potential. During EOL Summer Program, Student-Teacher teams will dialogue, set goals and plan for the upcoming year. The new skills and perspectives learned will create new energy to help set a framework around the issues that they choose to take on. Each school and community has their own culture and their own issues, so we can't tell you how to find success, but we'll give you the skills and tools to discover it within you. Throughout the school year, High 5 stays connected to each team, helping to facilitate and guide the leadership path that each team has chosen.

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The Summer Program Experience

EOL takes place in a camp-like setting over three days. Most activities take place outside in beautiful wooded surroundings and on High 5's Challenge Course. Participants sleep in cabins and eat family-style meals.

Each day focuses on one theme:

■ Day One begins with the introduction of our first theme; **CONNECT**. Developing interpersonal skills that foster healthy relationships is a central, and foundational theme of the EOL model that's highlighted throughout the program. Through practice, students and teachers will increase their awareness of the social and emotional skills necessary for successfully building and maintaining relationships that allow them to shape ideas, find solutions, and work collaboratively toward success.

On Day Two, participants will be introduced to the second theme; EMPOWER. In the EOL program, participants often describe the feeling of empowerment as finding their voice in the community; ultimately describing the moment they became a leader. In the EOL model, empowerment begins the moment an idea is validated, a voice is heard, or an example is set. Through hard work and adventure on the High 5 Challenge Course, students and teachers will come to learn that the power of leadership is accessible to anyone and with it, comes the development of skills and knowledge that will allow them to overcome obstacles, solve problems, and achieve goals.

LEAD... BE THE EXAMPLE! On Day Three, students and teachers will begin to take what they've learned and explore ways of applying their new skill to real life opportunities for action in the community and learn how to organize and facilitate student lead initiatives that will make a difference back in their own school and community.

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What's Next: After the Summer Program

Student-teacher teams begin their year with the new tools to make changes in their school and community. The team creates action plans to implement the ideas they identified. Our EOL teachers are available for consult to help see the plans put into place. Some of the plans that our EOL-ers have implemented:

The Keene High School team identified a need to develop and strengthen student-teacher relationships. The team designed a day-long adventure for students and their invited teachers at High 5, which included a challenge course experience for the entire group, and subsequent dialogue which opened new channels of communication and cooperation between the teachers and their students.

Essex Tech students planned and facilitated a professional development day for teachers and faculty. The students conducted a circuit of teambuilding activities and facilitated dialogue among breakout groups of teachers.

Manchester Youth Service Bureau students worked with multiple agencies in the area to coordinate the installation of water bottle filling stations at all sports fields.

The Lincoln Sudbury High School team designed and implemented a professional development program where teachers shadowed one student for an entire day of school. "Very eye opening," said one teacher. "I thought I had an understanding of what our students experience daily - I was way off."

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Applying to Attend EOL Summer Program
